In the time of Confirmation preparation, each student will be asked to give some form of Christian witness and service. To be a mature Christian means not only to “know” one’s faith, but to also accept the responsibility of acting in the name of Jesus Christ to our community. Service experiences should be an expression of the Spiritual and Corporal Works of Mercy.

You are asked to devote a minimum of 20 hours to this work. The time may be spent on one project or on several different activities.

The following is a suggested list of experiences which would enable you to serve others, free of charge.

- Collecting toiletries for Saint Vincent de Paul Society
- Decorate pumpkins for nursing homes
- Send Christmas cards or letters to nursing homes, armed forces, health care workers, first responders.
- Collect food for food pantries.
- Make dinner one night a week for families.
- Donate clothes to Emergency Services and Goodwill
- Donate Thanksgiving and Easter baskets to Emergency Services
- Donate socks and mittens to Emergency Services
- Help elderly neighbors with yard work / shoveling snow
